Increased access to medical abortion

On 1 August 2023, several restrictions on prescribing MS-2 Step (the medical abortion pill) were lifted.

MS-2 Step (a combination of mifepristone and misoprostol) can be used to terminate an intrauterine pregnancy of up to 63 days' gestation.

The lifting of restrictions by the <u>Therapeutic Goods Administration</u> means:

- GPs are no longer required to undertake mandatory training and registration to prescribe MS-2 Step.
- All pharmacists (rather than registered dispensers only) will be able to stock and dispense the medication.

- Read the National Blood Authority's Guideline for the Prophylactic use of Rh D immunoglobulin in pregnancy care, 2021. The guideline says: 'In the setting of medical termination of pregnancy before 10 weeks of gestation there is insufficient evidence to suggest the routine use of Rh D immunoglobulin." - If a woman who has had a medical abortion has complications or concerns, options for seeking help or advice include: calling healthdirect on 1800 022 222 or visiting the Women's Emergency Care (WEC) (both of which are available 24 hours, 7 days), or attending their nearest emergency department.

Thalassaemia referrals

We continue to receive several referrals every week where:

- a woman is known to be a carrier of thalassaemia (or her investigations raise this as a possibility), and
- there has been inadequate follow-up testing for the woman and/or her partner.

GPs are reminded that urgent partner screening for haemoglobinpathy is essential if a woman has an abnormal haemoglobin electrophoresis, or

thalassaemia/ haemoglobinopathy cannot be excluded.

As there can be long delays, please clearly indicate to the pathology service that the woman is pregnant and (where she has a partner) include her partner's details so their results can be considered together.

When making a referral to the Women's, please include both the woman's and (where applicable) her partner's results in your referral. If copies of results are not available, please indicate on the referral which laboratory conducted the tests.

Thalassemia testing consists of:

- FBE
- Ferritin
- Hb electrophoresis
- · Thalassaemia DNA result
- Partner name, DOB and their results for the above tests.

Parkville Connect

Parkville Connect is the provider portal that enables GPs, specialists and other community health practitioners to access the Electronic Medical Record (EMR) of their patients receiving care at:

- The Royal Women's Hospital
- The Royal Melbourne Hospital
- The Royal Children's Hospital and
- Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre.

The EMR system by itself does not currently enable automated cc of results (pathology and imaging) to SMCAs, GPs and other external providers. Parkville Connect is one way you can access these results.

Via Parkville Connect you can view:

- upcoming and past hospital visits
- inpatient and outpatient progress notes
- discharge and after-visit summaries
- laboratory and imaging results

Menopause management: online webinar

This webinar will provide a comprehensive overview of current evidence around best practice

menopause management. Participants will learn about the symptoms of menopause and pharmacological and non-pharmacological therapies. Menopause Hormone Therapy (MHT) will be discussed in detail including types, indications, contraindications, and when to cease MHT.

Dr Darling will also cover important considerations of MHT in the context of previous or current breast cancer. There will be opportunities to ask questions and address any knowledge gaps.
