

Introducing the Maternity and Newborn Emergencies (MANE) Program

A two-day multidisciplinary program facilitated by maternity and neonatal health professionals from the Royal Women's Hospital Maternity Services Education Program (MSEP) and the Royal Children's Hospital Paediatric Infant Perinatal Emergency Retrieval (PIPER).

Designed to assist the multidisciplinary team in advancing their maternity and newborn emergency knowledge and skills, the program is delivered via a range of didactic, simulation and skill station components.

The MANE program is open to all midwives, registered/enrolled nurses, general practitioners, obstetricians, medical and midwifery students and other clinicians appropriate at your site.

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Clinicians attending this program are eligible for professional development credit points and/or procedural grants with relevant professional bodies including:

Aims of the Maternity and Newborn Emergencies (MANE) Program

- Increase the knowledge of local maternity outcomes including frequency of clinical audits
- Increase knowledge and utilisation of local escalation pathways and reduce barriers
- Increase knowledge of regional and state referral pathways
- Increase evidence based clinical practice knowledge within local context
- Increase executive knowledge of local maternity outcomes and input into quality and safety activities

Tailoring the program to suit the needs of your maternity service

As a strong focus is placed on tailoring the program to best suit the needs of your maternity service, MSEP provide a pre-workshop consultation with key stakeholders at your site to understand specific learning needs of your staff.

Following the pre-workshop consultation, the program agenda will be developed in collaboration with your organisation to ensure that learning needs are addressed.

Core Modules

- Introduction to Cultural Safety in Maternity Care
- Victorian Maternity Services – the changing landscape (including trending Regional M&M topics)
- The effective team (team resource management)
- Newborn Resuscitation

The option to choose from one of the following Simulation Modules:

- PPH & activating MTP
- Breech vaginal birth
- Shoulder dystocia
- Cord prolapse
- Preterm birth
- Newborn resuscitation
- Eclampsia
- Maternal collapse

If the modules suggested do not directly address the needs of your service, the MSEP team can work with you to develop content that meets your specific need.

The option to choose from one of the following Elective Modules:

- Obesity in pregnancy & labour
- Pre-eclampsia and hypertensive disorders
- Risk management
- Clinical governance
- Induction of labour
- Maternal and newborn sepsis
- PPH and third stage management

Clinical workstations available include:

- Obstetric complication skill updates (instrumental, shoulder dystocia & vaginal breech birth) for medical staff; facilitated by RWH obstetric consultants.
- Maternity skill updates (vaginal breech birth, shoulder dystocia, IV hypertensive medications, ARM, VE, FSE application, episiotomy and NVB) for midwives & nurses; facilitated by RWH midwifery educators
- Neonatal resuscitation skill updates (ventilation, ECC, UVC, ETT & intubation); facilitated by PIPER neonatologists and neonatal educators.
