Pre-Submission Peer Review Process for research projects submitted to the RWH Research Committee

- 1. A Scientific Review Panel for research proposals involving humans at The Royal Women's Hospital has been established, with membership representative of all clinical and research groupings within the hospital.
- 2. Applicant(s) submitting projects must have their project peer-reviewed by a member of the Scientific Review Panel before being accepted to proceed to the RWH Research Committee, or by another process, such as by a Departmental Research Advisory Group (DRAG) that exists within the researcher's work area.
- 3. The Scientific Review Panel member or the DRAG will provide advice to the applicant(s) before submission, as well as complete a checklist of issues relevant to the application (see Presubmission Peer Review Proforma).
- 4. It is strongly recommended that applicants follow to checklist to ensure that their project complies with relevant issues before submission for peer review. Not all issues are relevant to all projects.
- 5. The applicant(s) must respond to any issues raised by the peer review prior.
- 6. When the project is submitted, evidence of the prior review (the Proforma) and the applicant(s)' responses to issues identified will be mandatory with the submission.
